### **NEW ZEALAND**

New Zealand's quarantine facilities are struggling to cope with the influx of New Zealanders wishing to return home before the introduction of quarantine fees. As a consequence, Air New Zealand is taking no further bookings until the 9th August. The airline is working with the government to develop a voucher system to assist residents who are currently attempting to return home.

The centrepiece of the coming New Zealand election will focus on migration and jobs. The National Party has confirmed that those travellers returning to New Zealand from the 3rd of October will be charged a fee for the cost of quarantine if they are elected, which is similar to the arrangement in place in Australia.

Under this system a single adult will incur a proposed fee of \$3000. An additional adult sharing the same room will be charged another \$1000, and children over the age of three, an extra \$500 each. Children under three will not incur a fee. This would apply to all people entering quarantine, although there may be some exemptions available for New Zealand citizens and permanent residents on compassionate grounds.

## AUSTRALIA

We anticipate changes to the Migration Program Planning Levels for 2020-21 due to higher levels of unemployment within the Australian workforce as a result of COVID-19. Skilled Nominated Subclass 190 and the Skilled Regional Sponsored Subclass 491 visa categories have experienced a delay in nomination submissions from states and territories as they await the release of new quotas from the federal government. Processing time for visas has increased, and therefore onshore applicants are being prioritised over offshore applicants at this time.

Currently only Australian citizens, their immediate family members, permanent residents, and New Zealanders who usually reside in Australia, can travel to Australia. Travel exemptions can be considered for compassionate or compelling reasons. Those with critical skills, such as health workers, can also apply for travel exemptions.

# CV TIPS

Struggling to write your CV? Here are some of our team's hot tips

- Write your CV in reverse chronological order
- When referring to past positions include your employer's name, the dates you were employed and your position
- Do not forget to provide a brief overview of your employer and your position as well. Focus on your clinical skills and duties
- Your most recent roles are the most relevant, make sure to provide more information about your most recent positions and less about your earliest roles
- Include professional development relevant to the past three years. This is a requirement to gaining registration in Australia and New Zealand

## **REGISTRATION TIP**

The Australian registration board will require evidence of your course curriculum, the syllabus, and your academic transcript. These can be difficult to obtain. Arranging them as soon as possible will make your registration process much easier.

Immigration New Zealand has recently made changes to instructions around the exceptions criteria which allowed Partners and Dependent Children of New Zealand citizens or residents, who hold a visa based on their relationship with a New Zealand citizen, resident partner or parent to travel to New Zealand, without seeking approval.
